Dear homeowner or occupier,

As part of Surrey County Council's commitment to improving roads and pavements, Newhache and Locks Meadow has been selected for pavement slurry works.

Our preparation works will take place Monday 2 February for 5 days (excluding weekends) – Working hours: 8am to 4pm.

The extents of our works are from High Street to Newhache and Locks Meadow.

When we return to complete full Pavement Slurry, new signs and information will be distributed.

We will make sure you can get to and from your house or business when it is safe to do so. Please talk to a member of our staff on site if you need help – they are keen to deliver the work with minimal disruption to you.



Please take extra care during this time and ensure that you do not walk or drive on the wet surface. The wet sections of footway will be closed off until it has dried. Please check shoes are free from material before entering your home, as this can stick to them and ensure you check pet paws before they go inside.

- Weed killing - The pavement will be sprayed to minimise weed growth with herbicide treatment twice prior to any works taking place.
- Pedestrian traffic management will be in place to cater for the closures. An alternative route will be provided.
- Weather dependent – we can only carry out these works when it is dry and fine.
- Extent of the works – our works extent is shown opposite; however, we may skip areas of the pavement where the surface is new and in good condition.
- Concrete areas - We cannot surface over concrete; slurry seal does not stick to concrete.

- There will be some noise, but we will try to keep this to a minimum.

Please cut back any overgrown vegetation, tree branches, hedges or shrubs from your garden that are hanging or growing over the pavement to expose the full width of the pavement surface before our works start.

It is essential to keep the road free from parked vehicles to enable the work to proceed as planned.

We thank you for your patience while we carry out these works and apologise for any inconvenience caused.
